## Hereditary Breast Cancer



1 in 8 women will develop breast cancer in her lifetime




10% of all breast cancer is hereditary

You can inherit an increased risk for certain types of cancer, but you cannot inherit cancer itself.



## Risk factors include:

- Family history of young breast cancer (under age 50)
- Multiple family members with breast cancer
- Multiple primary breast cancer diagnoses
- · A family with Ashkenazi Jewish ancestry
- · Having a known gene mutation in your family





Knowing if hereditary cancer runs in your family can be empowering information.

Are you at increased risk? There may be things you can do to improve your outcome.
